

WEEKLY WORDS FROM THE ROCK:

LENTEN NORMS OF FASTING AND ABSTAINING: I will keep the norms of fasting and abstaining in my column throughout Lent as a reference point for people seeking the information.

<u>Fasting:</u> Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting. The norms of fasting are obligatory from age 18 to 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Abstinence: Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday are obligatory days of abstinence. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon Catholics from age 14 onwards.

WHAT IS LOVE? Today's gospel poses for us the famous line from John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son so that all who believe in him might not perish but may have eternal life." I see the phrase "John 3:16" held up on signs at various sporting events and still wonder what it has to do with football, basketball, or baseball. If someone has the answer, please let me know. However, when it comes to our faith, these words define everything. God loved us so much that He sent His son. Why? That Jesus Christ could suffer and die for us so that we may live with him eternally.

When it comes to the word "love" we use it for all types of things. I love my dog. I love my cat. I love my pickup. I love my new boat. That is understandable. Yet, real love takes us to a deeper level. Let us try and understand this type of love. I once took the word love, broke down each letter of the word, and assigned a word to each letter to help us better understand the deeper essence of love. Here is how it looks: L = Lasts. That is correct. Love lasts. No matter what comes one's way, love is always present. What overcomes hurts? Love. What overcomes sin? Love. It is always love. O = Other. Love has at the heart the other person. When I was ordained to the priesthood, I was ordained for the sake of serving God's people. It is done with love in mind. People struggle with priests who are self-centered and selfish. What they look for in a shepherd

is someone who cares about them. When that happens, people see love brought to life.

V = Volume. Too many times I hear the words, "I thought they know I loved them." Thinking isn't always knowing. One must express (speak = volume) the words "I love you" to let people know they are loved.

E = Everywhere. It doesn't matter if one spouse is in China while the other is at home in the United States, love knows no bounds. It is to be lived and expressed in every time and every place.

In closing, when we think about love, keep these words in mind. Love = lasts, other, volume and everywhere. For that is how one defines the love of Jesus Christ.


