WEEKLY WORDS FROM THE ROCK:

LENTEN NORMS OF FASTING & ABSTAINING: I will keep the norms of fasting and abstaining in my column throughout Lent as a reference point for people seeking the information.

Fasting: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting. The norms of fasting are obligatory from age 18 to 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Abstinence: Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday are obligatory days of abstinence. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon Catholics from age 14 onwards.

WHERE WOULD I BE? I pray for all of you as we begin the journey of Holy Week. There is a famous African-American spiritual which is sung during portions of Holy Week entitled "Were You There." It is a catchy hymn which I find myself singing from time to time. It isn't complicated in composition. It bases itself off the word "Were you there" with four different verses:

- A. When they crucified my Lord.
- B. When they nailed him to the tree.
- C. When they pierced him in the side.
- D. When the sun refused to shine.

What has grabbed my attention as we begin Holy Week is if I were there at the crucifixion of our Lord, where would I be? There are many different options:

- 1. Would I have been like one of the apostles not be present having fled out of fear?
- 2. Would I have been at the foot of the cross with Mary the Mother of Jesus?
- 3. Would I have been mocking Jesus at how "weak" he seemed to be?
- 4. Would I have blended in with the crowd without saying a word?
- 5. Whether mocking, silent, or at the foot of the cross, would I have understood what the magnitude of what happened when Jesus died on the cross?

Of course, without being present, we really don't know. However, there is another option that I really pondered this week. It reads, "What if I just passed by the crucifixion scene without a care in the world? Without caring who was there. Without hearing the words being "thrown" Jesus' way. Without hearing the cries and tears being shed. Without laying eyes on the man "in the middle" who had been crucified. It is this last option that frightens me the most. To not care about the man who suffered and died for me so that I may live a new type of life and have hope in eternity tugs at my heart. Holy Week wakes up within me the need for a Savior and how Jesus Christ has changed my life.

In the week ahead, contemplate the question I posed. If you were at the crucifixion of Jesus Christ, where would you be?


