WEEKLY WORDS FROM THE ROCK:

I DOUBT! The Second Sunday of Easter is known as Divine Mercy Sunday. The gospel story comes to us from the gospel of John and centers on Thomas (see John 20:19-31). The disciples tell Thomas, "We have seen the Lord." Thomas' reply is the famous, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Such a statement has led over time to define Thomas as "doubting Thomas." To Thomas' credit, if I were of that time, the words of Thomas may very well have been my own. After all, resurrection was something beyond what the mind had ever conceived. To this day, I still doubt. Want examples? Here are a few:

1. I doubt the second coming of Jesus Christ will occur in 2024.

2. I doubt the Minnesota Twins will win the World Series in 2024.

3. I doubt the Minnesota Vikings will have a winning record for 2024.

4. I doubt the Minnesota Wild will make the Stanley Cup playoffs in 2024.

5. I doubt I will be pastoring only three parishes by the end of this year.

6. With the dry conditions, I doubt my brother will be harvesting 250-bushel corn and 70-bushel beans in 2024.

7. I doubt this election year will go by "quietly." You get the idea.

I could very well be proven wrong on most if not all my predictions and that is okay. In fact, I feel all of us could put together a list of "doubting" statements. To doubt is to be human. It is the response of Jesus to Thomas that I find fascinating. When Jesus appears to Thomas, he doesn't become angry, throw around vile words, chastise him for his lack of faith, rather tells him, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Whether Thomas does any of this, the gospels make no mention. What is certain is Thomas' belief in the Lord, "My Lord and my God!"

If Jesus appeared to me this very day, I am not certain what words would come out of my mouth, but Thomas' seem appropriate. Jesus is our one and only Lord and God and he is risen! Thus, if Jesus does prove me wrong and comes in 2024, I can live with that. Just help me with one thing-may I always believe! **ELECTRIC MOTORS**
