WEEKLY WORDS FROM THE ROCK:

BORING!!! In his book, <u>Did Adam & Eve Have Belly</u> <u>Buttons? And 199 Other Questions From Catholic</u> <u>Teenagers</u>, Matthew Pinto on pages 239-241 deals with two questions on the Mass.

Question 190: Why can't they make church services more fun?

Answer: Since when is "fun" the most important thing in life? If someone lives simply to "have fun," that person will end up being very selfish and, most likely, quite unhappy. Focusing only on our needs is empty and unfulfilling. It is only when we get out of ourselves and live for others that we truly find peace. Knowing, loving, and serving God and our neighbor is why we are here on earth (Matthew 22: 35-40). When one builds their life on the more important things, going to Mass and worshipping God becomes easier. Actually, they become things we really want to do.

Question 191: Why is Mass boring?

Answer: There are at least four reasons why people, especially the young, are bored at Mass:

1. Many people do not understand what really happens at Mass. When we actively listen to the Word of God at Mass, we receive encouragement, wisdom, and guidance (2 Timothy 3:16-17). When we receive the Eucharist in a state of grace, we are preparing our soul for its final destination – eternal happiness and peace in heaven (John 6:56). If we really understood the amazing things that happen at Mass, we would have greater interest.

2. Many think they are at Mass to be entertained. They are not. They are there to worship God and give back to Him the honor and glory He is due (Exodus 20:1-6,8-11).

3. Many people have not been taught the faith in an effective manner. Poor catechesis often leads to lack of concern about the things of God and love for things of the world.

4. We are addicted to excitement and entertainment from watching and listening to too much television and pop music. We have an overstimulated society. The advertising industry knows this. This is why they have reduced TV commercials to as little as fifteen seconds in length. When we begin to slow down, we begin to appreciate the more sublime riches in life, such as the Mass.

What I find amazing about the Mass is after twentyeight years of priesthood, I have celebrated around 10,000 Masses and not once have I been bored. Tired at times but never bored. The Mass is what Jesus left us to feed our souls with the food for eternal life. If there was a better/different way, he would have left it for us. Jesus knows what he is doing so trust him.
