WEEKLY WORDS FROM THE ROCK:

BODIES IN HEAVEN! During the Easter season, we hear many resurrection stories. Speaking of the resurrection and resurrection life, let us look at a couple of questions from Matthew Pinto's book, <u>Did Adam & Eve Have Belly Buttons?</u> And 199 Other Questions From Catholic Teenagers.

Question 108 (pages 141-142): What does the Catholic Church teach about what our bodies will be like in heaven? Answer: We are told in Scripture and in Sacred Tradition that our bodies will be perfected (1 Corinthians 15:40-58; Philippians 3:21). Theologians have suggested four characteristics that best describe what they will be like in heaven: impassable, subtle, agile, and possessing clarity. Our glorified bodies will be impassable. They will experience no pain, suffering, weariness, hunger, or thirst. Scripture says, "God will wipe away every tear from their eyes, for the former things have passed away" (Revelation 21:4). We will also have the gift of subtlety. We will have a human body with the characteristics of a spirt. Just as Christ could walk through walls after His resurrection (John 20:19-20), it follows that we should be able to walk through walls. God will assimilate the characteristics of a spirit to the body without destroying the body's material characteristics. We will possess the gift of agility, which means we will not be subject to the forces of nature as we were on earth. Our playground will not be limited to the small area we can presently cover with our human powers. Rather, the farthest reaches of the universe will be accessible with the swiftness of a thought. Our bodies will also respond to the saintly direction of the soul, whereas on earth they fought against the good intentions of the will. Finally, our bodies will have clarity (1 Corinthians 13:12) in thought and appearance. We will have glorified bodies without the ailments and infirmities of our earthly bodies. Amputations will be mended. Those who are blind will regain sight. Our immortal souls will have a more glorious home in our new bodies (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1042).

Question 113 (pages 145-146): Can you see things in heaven? Answer: Yes, and there seems to be two different types of sights in heaven: the "sight" of the mind and soul, and actual physical sight. We will see God "face-to-face" (1 Corinthians 13:12). However, the sight will be different from the sight experienced with our material bodies. If I ask you, "Do you see what I mean?" you are really "seeing" with your mind. This is similar to how we will know God, because God the Father does not have a body (John 4:24). We will experience God even more closely than we experience our own thoughts. We will know God in a much more direct way than the way we experience things here on earth with our senses. We will experience God without having anything block the experience (Revelation 7:9, 15). Even thoughts in our minds are "blocks" to "the real thing," because they are simply mental representations.

The second type of sight is the physical sight we experience on earth. At the end of time, after the general resurrection, we will literally see Jesus, Mary, and the saints, and our bodies will be rejoined to our souls. However, our "sight" will be different from our current experience because we will see God in all the creatures we gaze upon (1 Corinthians 15:41-44). And because God wants all of us to be happy in heaven, we will surely see everything necessary for our happiness (Psalm 36:8-10).

Based on the doctrine of the Communion of the Saints, we also believe the saints in heaven do have some knowledge of those on earth (Revelation 6:9-10; Hebrews 12:1). We will know and understand the human experience much more deeply than we do now.
