WEEKLY WORDS FROM THE ROCK:

My Poor Shoulder - Part 2

I shared in my column of last week an incident that happened in my life back in 2021. Here is a synopsis. On my parent's home place, they planted a row of dogwoods on a portion of the north and east side of the premise. Its purpose was to add color to the farm site and catch any snow blowing into the yard. As we learned, not only was it good at catching snow, but it also served as a great "catcher" of chopped corn stalks and husks. My brother has a chopping corn head which grinds the entire corn stalk during the process of harvesting. What remains is very small, and with the right wind, can easily be blown for miles. Such is what happened. We had a strong wind and elements of the chopped corn stalks from the field around my parent's home ended up in our rows of dogwood.

This was quite the dilemma. My mother tried to take a rake and hoe to remove the elements from the dogwood. The problem is dogwoods tend to grow close together. No hoe or rake was going to serve the purpose. Thus, my mother came up with another plan which would lead to my doom. She decided to burn them out. It worked; however, in the process of burning out the corn stalks, she also killed all the branches on the dogwoods from top to bottom. Enter yours truly. I took a lopper and cut each branch off as close to the ground as possible. During the endeavor, only two dogwoods were not affected by mom's fateful decision. It was a hot summer day and I was pouring sweat by the time I finished lopping.

The night before my father was to go in for heart surgery, my sister was loading the lopped off branches all alone. I felt sorry for her so I pitched in to the help. We loaded the back of the pickup and headed for another farm site for the branches to be offloaded. Here is where problems evolved. I decided to lay on the branches in the back of the pickup and told my sister to drive very slowly. Everything was working just fine until the wind caught some of the branches hanging over the cab. I was in trouble. I was no match for the force of the wind. I was going out the back of the pickup. Realizing my predicament, I made a choice. I decided to jump, land on my feet, and run. Everything went final until, after my jump, I took two steps, at which time my life went dark. Literally. The next two hours of my life are a complete blank, total darkness.

My brother took me to the Emergency Room in Albert Lea and on the way, I finally came to. I realized I was in some pain. The left side of my forehead was cut in several places. My entire left side under my arm had seen better days and I had a cut on my left knee. However, what took the greatest blow was my left shoulder. It hurt and I couldn't move it easily.

It was at this point that it dawned on me what had happened. After I had jumped from the pickup, landed upright and taken two steps, I was no longer able to stay upright. I fell on the gravel road with my left arm out exposing the left side of my body to the gravel and road. The left side of my head hit the gravel road which knocked me out.

Now we get to my poor left shoulder. Picture your arm out and the left side of your body landing directly on gravel with the brunt of the fall coming under your left armpit. Landing squarely on that region, my body came off the ground before coming to rest. I didn't realize the severity for a day or two when I had tremendous pain in my shoulder. Fortunately, nothing was broken but to this day if I attempt to climb on monkey bars, the pain in my left shoulder is so great that I can't remain on the monkey bars. I don't know how much damage was done to my shoulder but even in my world, the reality is that it will never be the same.

Within this synopsis, I can't help but remember where everything began.

- A. Dogwoods.
- B. Chopped Corn Stalks.
- C. My mother deciding to "burn them out."

In John's gospel, he speaks about the vine and the branches (see John 15:1-17). As I think back on the events, that story of Jesus struck me. And while a dogwood isn't considered a vine, dogwood branches grow so close together that they form a protective bond. That is the story of Jesus Christ. As church, Jesus tells us to remain with one another. We form a protective bond built around the well-being as each member and charity. What keeps it all together is the power of Jesus Christ. In the winter months, after their leaves have dropped, dogwoods turn a bright red. That red reminds me of the blood that Jesus poured out for the well-being of his church. My shoulder's pain pales in comparison with Jesus Christ dying on the cross.

As the story of "My Poor Shoulder" reiterates, I am a firm believer that each story shares a component of faith. Think about a story from your life and how the mystery of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit unfolds within it. God always has a mystery to share!
