WEEKLY WORDS FROM THE ROCK:

Those were the Days

I was listening to a podcast with football being the topic. They were amazed at how a sport begins with practice around 90 degrees and can finish, with the playoffs, in snow and wind. That got me reflecting on my football days.

Did I look forward to two-a-day practices in August? No. I remember how nervous I was the days leading up to practice. Dread might be a better word. Practice meant the following:

- Stretching. We always started practice with stretching. An important practice to condition the body.
- Running. We ran and ran and ran. The practice of running I didn't like was call "The Ladder". We would run up the football field and back down the football field in 10-yard increments.
- Sit-ups on the bleacher. We had a bleacher where fans could sit. We would do sit-ups using the bleacher as our support.
- More running. The bleacher I just mentioned was on a hillside. Our coach loved to have us run up the hill.
- And more running. We ran from one practice station to the next.
- Weightlifting. After practice, we would have weightlifting sessions.

Between all the running, we were split up by groups. On offense, I played tight end. I practiced with the offensive line. We did various drills:

- Hit dummies.
- Practiced blocking skills.
- Refined techniques.
- Practiced blocking against each other.
- Learned how to block and release in going out for a pass.
- Learned how to double-team block.

On defense, I played middle linebacker. Some of the various drills were:

- Learning proper tackling techniques.
- Learning how to shed a blocker.
- Learning how to flow along the line of scrimmage without over pursuing a play.

These drills we practiced day after day for the sole purpose of preparing us for game day. Thinking back to the podcast I mentioned previously, they were correct. We began in the heart of summer and played into November. The weather in November was unpredictable varying from unseasonably warm to cold and snow. I never liked playing in the cold. Cold plays with your mind. Too, it messes with one physically. My hands would get cold making it more difficult to tackle or catch a football.

In the end, everything was about formulating a team. A team which believed in each other and played for each other. Such is the story of God. He molds us each day to make us the holiest person we can be, and every Sunday we gather as a "team," as God's people, to give God worship and praise. Nourished by God's word and sacrament (Christ's body and blood), we are sent into the world to proclaim a belief in the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. In the week ahead, let us allow God to mold us and ready us to spread the gospel to the ends of the earth.

THE STORY OF THE QUEENSHIP OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Pope Pius XII established this feast in 1954. But the **Blessed Virgin Mary's** queenship has roots in Scripture. At the Annunciation, Gabriel announced that Mary's Son would receive the throne of David and rule forever. At the Visitation, Elizabeth calls Mary "mother of my Lord." As in all the mysteries of Mary's life, she is closely associated with Jesus: Her queenship is a share in Jesus' kingship. We can also recall that in the Old Testament the mother of the king has great influence in court.

In the fourth century Saint Ephrem called Mary "Lady" and "Queen." Later Church fathers and doctors continued to use the title. Hymns of the 11th to 13th centuries address Mary as queen: "Hail, Holy Queen," "Hail, Queen of Heaven," "Queen of Heaven." The Dominican rosary and the Franciscan crown as well as numerous invocations in Mary's litany celebrate her queenship.

The feast is a logical follow-up to the Assumption, and is now celebrated on the octave day of that feast. In his 1954 encyclical *To the Queen of Heaven*, Pius XII points out that Mary deserves the title because she is Mother of God, because she is closely associated as the New Eve with Jesus' redemptive work, because of her preeminent perfection, and because of her intercessory power.

Reflection: As Saint Paul suggests in Romans 8:28–30, God has predestined human beings from all eternity to share the image of his Son. All the more was Mary predestined to be the mother of Jesus. As Jesus was to be king of all creation, Mary, in dependence on Jesus, was to be queen. All other titles to queenship derive from this eternal intention of God. As Jesus exercised his kingship on earth by serving his Father and his fellow human beings, so did Mary exercise her queenship. As the glorified Jesus remains with us as our king till the end of time (Matthew 28:20), so does Mary, who was assumed into heaven and crowned queen of heaven and earth.
